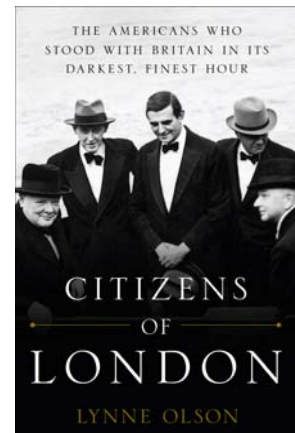

FORMER GOVERNOR JOHN WINANT SUBJECT OF TALK AT THE NEW HAMPSHIRE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Lynne Olson, author of “Citizens of London” to Speak on March 4

CONCORD, NH—*Citizens of London*, a new book by Lynne Olson, is the behind-the-scenes story of how the United States forged its wartime alliance with Britain, told from the perspective of three key American players: Edward R. Murrow, the head of CBS News in Europe; Averill Harriman, the hard-driving millionaire who ran FDR’s Lend-Lease program in London; and John Gilbert Winant, the least known but most crucial of the three—the shy former New Hampshire governor who became the new U.S. ambassador to England after Joseph Kennedy quit the post.



Olson will share this story in a lecture at the New Hampshire Historical Society’s library, located at 30 Park Street, Concord, on Thursday, March 4, at 7 p.m. Admission is free. Copies of *Citizens of London* will be available for sale, in partnership with Gibson’s Bookstore.
