Editorial Policy

Historical New Hampshire is the journal of the New Hampshire Society and is a benefit of membership in the Society. The journal is published for twofold purpose of encouraging research in New Hampshire history and bringing fresh and interesting historical material to the public. The articles and book reviews in *Historical New Hampshire* pertain to any aspect of New Hampshire history and culture, although material of regional and national interest may be included if pertinent to New Hampshire.

Articles in *Historical New Hampshire* are peer-reviewed and should reflect original research, innovative approaches, and good writing. Unsolicited book reviews are not accepted, and authors are advised to contact the editor with queries concerning their articles before submission. All correspondence should be addressed to the editor. Articles will be reviewed by the editor and by at least two members of the Editorial Advisory Board.

Articles in *Historical New Hampshire* vary in length, but generally they are between 2500 and 7500 words. On matters of style, authors are asked to consult *A Manual of Style* (University of Chicago Press). Text copy and notes should be double-spaced and typewritten or processed on a letter-quality printer on 8 ½ by 11-inch standard bond, one side only, with 1-inch margins. Notes and tables should appear on separate pages following the text. The use of subheads is encouraged. Authors should submit three copies of the manuscript while retaining a fourth copy. Authors who have illustrations to suggest should send photocopies (in triplicate) rather than photographic prints or digital images.

Reviews of major museum exhibitions or films are welcome, as are shorter entries for our “Notes and Documents” section. Short research notes are not peer-reviewed and are included at the discretion of the editor.
