

# How to Find the New Hampshire Historical Society

(Map on next page)

- **Museum [6 Eagle Square]**
- **Library and Administration [30 Park Street]**

## From the South

On I-93N, take exit 14. Turn **L** and merge into the **R** lane. At the 4<sup>th</sup> set of lights, turn **R** by the Holiday Inn onto North Main Street. Directly after the Holiday Inn turn **R** onto Storrs Street.

## From the North

On I-93S, take exit 14. Turn **R** and stay in the R lane. At the 2<sup>nd</sup> set of lights, turn **R** by the Holiday Inn onto North Main Street. Directly after the Holiday Inn turn **R** onto Storrs Street.

## From the East

Take I-393 to end. Stay in **L** lane for turn onto North Main Street. After turn, pass through 2 sets of lights. Take next **L** onto Storrs Street just before the Holiday Inn.

## From the West

Take Routes 202 & 9 to I-89. Follow I-89 to I-93N. Then follow directions above for approaches from the South.

## Museum Entrance & Free Parking during Business Hours

- Follow Storrs Street around behind the Holiday Inn. Under the overhead parking garage, the museum is the stone building on the **R**. You may wish to drop your passengers at the crosswalk.
- Take the next **L** to enter the museum's parking lot. \*
- Receive a ticket at the gate and proceed to the parking area on the **R** reserved for museum visitors.
- In the museum, redeem the ticket for a token that lets you exit the lot.
- • Visitors to the **NHHS Library at 30 Park Street** please note: only public on-street parking is available in the immediate vicinity. Visitors are welcome to park in the museum's lot and walk to the library, approximately 1-½ blocks.

- \* **Buses are welcome in our lot, but entry to the lot is difficult. Free bus parking is available at the Everett Arena [see map]. Parking lot hours are from 9:15 AM to 5:00 PM. The museum and the lot are closed to the general public Mondays from October 16 to November 30 and from January 1 to June 30.**
