Collection Overview

Biographical Information/ Administrative Information:

William Whittle (1764-1830) was born in Litchfield, NH. He served in the Revolutionary War and was in his native town until 1795 when he moved to Weare, NH. He was a large landowner and owned many businesses including a store and tavern. He was involved in the manufacturing of potash and in building a cotton factory. Amongst other town activities, Whittle served as town surveyor in 1796, and was a clerk of the Universalist Church.

His son Thomas (b. 1792) married Mary Folsom and settled in Deering, NH. Son James (b.1800) practiced law in Concord, NH and afterwards moved West. Son John (b. 1811) married Susan D. Chase and resided in Weare, NH where he dealt in real estate & Amesbury carriages.

Doctor James Peterson Whittle (b. 1836), son of John Whittle, married Hattie A. Hayward and resided in Weare, NH.
