SEACOAST WIND ENSEMBLE TO PERFORM IN EAGLE SQUARE ON JUNE 30

CONCORD, NH—The New Hampshire Historical Society will host the Seacoast Wind Ensemble in a free outdoor concert on Thursday, June 30, at 7 p.m., in downtown Concord's Eagle Square, just outside the Historical Society's museum. The concert is made possible by the Duncan S. McGowan Memorial Fund for Eagle Square. The Seacoast Wind Ensemble includes more than 50 adults performing on bassoon, clarinet, euphonium, flute, French horn, harp, oboe, percussion, piccolo, saxophone, trombone, trumpet, and tuba. The ensemble performs marches, show tunes, jazz, classical/symphonic adaptations for band, Broadway, and modern pop-style tunes, all suitable for the whole family.
