Abstract:

The Lawrence E. and Charlotte Phelps Ruth Papers document World War II in New Hampshire and in the American Armed Forces. Charlotte Ruth's diary, kept when she lived in Meredith, NH, and her husband was away, mentions her work and church activities. Materials written by Lawrence Ruth include his basic training diary and letters from abroad. There are a number of letters from Blake Pitcher, who wrote to Charlotte from Italy, where he was with the 64th General Hospital Medical Supply Office.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information

Charlotte Phelps was born in Malden, MA, on July 14, 1910 to George P. Phelps and his wife, Mabel Younglove. She graduated from Keene High School in Keene, NH, and from Keene Teachers College. Charlotte was a teacher in Concord, NH. On March 3, 1942, she married Lawrence E. Ruth, and together had one son, David P. Ruth. She was active in local organizations such as St. Paul's Church, Eastern Star, and the Pierce Brigade. Charlotte died on April 13, 1992 at Concord.

Lawrence Elmer Ruth was born in Colorado on September 27, 1907 to Hamilton Ruth and Goldie Pelz, and was a nurse in the New Hampshire State Hospital in Concord, NH, beginning in 1933. He married at Concord, as his second wife, Charlotte Phelps on March 3, 1942. Lawrence served in World War II, enlisting in Manchester, NH, on June 15, 1942. His World War II service as a nurse was in the Pacific in the 3rd Camp Battalion. He died on April 17, 1985 at Concord.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Lawrence E. and Charlotte Phelps Ruth Papers contain Charlotte Ruth's dairy, kept between 1942 and 1944 while she was living in Meredith, NH, which mentions war news and letters to and from her husband, as well as her daily activities, including work and church. Lawrence kept a daily journal during basic training in Virginia and Texas from June 29 to September 16, 1942.

Also included is correspondence from her husband, Lawrence Ruth, and Blake Pitcher, that relates their wartime experiences. Blake wrote from Italy about conditions at his hospital (he was with the 64th General Hospital Medical Supply Office), volcanic activity, and a palace visit. Other correspondence includes a letter from a pen pal in a textile mill in India, a piece of stationery with an image of the Connecticut River Bridge in Walpole, and a letter from Tony Mancini in Japan. Post-war correspondence includes a letter from Styles Bridges in 1951 responding to Lawrence's comments about the dismissal of General MacArthur.

Papers with the 64th General Hospital include their newsletter "The 64th General Observer," 1942; "Battle Lines," 1945; and "The Roar," 1945.

Arrangement:

The Lawrence E. and Charlotte Phelps Ruth Papers are arranged by genre and author, beginning with Charlotte Phelps Ruth's diary, then incoming and outgoing correspondence in chronological order, then Lawrence E. Ruth's basic training diary, ending with other materials such as receipts.
