Photographs in this collection are of Annalee Davis Thorndike, her family, and locations in Concord and Meredith, New Hampshire. They are black and white images on album pages. Most are identified and dated. There are no photographs of the dolls she created, of the manufacturing facility, or of the workers.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information:

Barbara Annalee Davis (1915-2002) was born in Concord, NH, to Emerson Davis (1890-1926) and Doris Ladd (1890-1972). As a child, she made marionettes and later dolls for display, with sewn-on clothing and in set positions. In the Depression years of the 1930s, she sold them through what was then known as the New Hampshire League of Arts and Crafts (later the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen), and in department stores in Boston.

On April 19, 1941, she married Charles "Chip" Thorndike (1914-2008), a chicken farmer in Meredith, NH. By the 1950s, the poultry farm was no longer profitable and she increased production of her dolls, incorporating the Annalee Mobilitee Dolls company in 1955 with her husband.

Chip Thorndike created wire armatures that permitted the dolls to be posed and made small wood accessories to accompany them (skis, little boats, etc.). The dolls became promotional items for tourism and were popular as themed collectibles. To increase production, the couple created a factory in Meredith, which at its peak covered 14 acres of land with 7 buildings and over 300 employees.

The market for the dolls declined in the 1990s, and manufacture of the dolls and accessories was outsourced to Hong Kong, though design and marketing operations remained in Meredith. The business had been given to Annalee and Chip Thorndike's sons, Townsend and Charles (Chuck), but after lawsuits between them, the business and Meredith property were sold in 2008. At the time of writing this finding aid (2022), Annalee Dolls continue to be made in Hong Kong.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Annalee Davis Thorndike Photograph Collection consists of photograph albums containing family images, with pictures of Thorndike's children and relatives. Another album contains images of Thorndike's mother, Doris (Ladd) Davis, and her friends and life at Dana Hall School (Wellesley, MA), 1909-1911.

A baby book of Annalee Davis Thorndike kept by her mother between 1915 and 1918 provides information about the life of a young child in early 20th-century New Hampshire. It contains accounts of the baby's development and activities along with numerous photos, greeting cards, and some locks of hair. For example, there is a description of her first birthday party, with photos of the one-year-old guests, their mothers, and a list of gifts.

There are 5 audio cassette tapes of conversations with Thorndike, perhaps from the exhibit of her dolls at the New Hampshire Historical Society in 1999.

There are no photographs of Annalee Dolls; the manufacturing facility in Meredith, NH; workers; or offices.

Arrangement:

The photographs were in albums, some of which were unbound and without covers. The pages are arranged chronologically as much as possible, though many are undated. The Baby Book pages are in order as found.
