Abstract:

The Burley and Haley Family Papers include correspondence among members of this Epping, NH, extended and widely scattered family, especially between 1850 and 1930. There are also records about farm management between 1900 and 1950. The business records of Joseph C. Burley (1830-1900) in his various activities as a farmer, local politician, dealer in lumber and wood, and investor in land in Kansas are extensive for the years 1870-1900. Associated photographs and ephemera complete the collection.

The Burley and Haley Family Papers were given to the Society in November 2016 by the Joseph C. and Robert M. Burley Family Trust.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information:

The Burley/Haley family was based in Epping, NH, on land purchased in 1752. The extent of the acreage owned by the family waxed and waned over time and included 265 acres in 1883. There were usually at least two dwellings, one at 264 and one at 270 N. River Road. The property left the family in the early 21st century, and thereafter papers found in various locations in the dwellings and outbuildings were given to the New Hampshire Historical Society.

Papers in the collection are all related to people who lived in residences on the property, descendants of one of the early owners, Thomas Burley (1766-1847). His son and daughter-in-law, Captain Benjamin Burley (1803-1861) and Elizabeth Ann Cilley Burley (1804-1876), were the parents of Joseph Cilley Burley (1830-1900), who, with his wife Sarah Elizabeth Haley Burley (1833-1912), lived there in the last half of the nineteenth century. Although three of their five children died or moved away, an unmarried daughter, Jennie, also known as Jane (1872-1962), lived there all her life, and another, Alice Burley Curtis (1870-1946) spent her last years

at the property. Their brother, Harry B. Burley (1867-1954), managed the property from his home in Massachusetts. His papers and those of his wife, Louise Wells Burley (1878-1955), also ended up in one of the houses on the Epping property, which was a beloved gathering place and focus for the entire extended family, including relatives by marriage.

A short biography of each family member for whom there is correspondence will be found at the beginning of their corresponding subseries below.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Burley and Haley Family Papers consist primarily of correspondence, but also of business papers, ephemera, and photographs of the Burleys, Haleys, and their extended families from 1752 to 2015, with the bulk of materials dating from 1850 to 1930. The family letters all belonged to people who lived or spent extended periods of time in the dwellings on the family homestead in Epping, NH, which was in the family for over 250 years from 1752 to the early 21st century. During the 19th and early 20th centuries, this large extended family corresponded with far flung relatives in California, Texas, Arkansas, and Michigan, as well with nearer ones in various locations in the northeast. Children wrote from boarding school and college, sisters to each other about health and home management, suitors to future spouses, and husbands wrote home while away on business trips. The correspondence also includes incoming letters from friends and associates. Several women had long friendships that document the activities of both single and married middle class, New England women in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

Materials not identified with any particular family member and found unassociated with any individual's letters are together in the ephemera series. Ephemera relating specifically to individuals (invitations, programs, greeting cards, etc.) are filed with the individual.

Business records, divided into three subseries by the donor, include:

- Farm records for managing the family farm in Epping in the 1920s to 1940. Harry Burley, responsible for the farm, lived in the Boston area and employed farm managers and workers. This is the resulting correspondence.
- A few of Harry B. Burley's business papers from his tenure as an engineer for the city of Nashua, NH, during the 1890s and a further few about an accident he sustained while working as an inspector for an insurance company. Although he established his own manufacturing business in Massachusetts in 1905, his business records do not include materials about that company.
- Joseph C. Burley's extensive business records from 1860 to 1900. He was an Epping politician, businessman (dealing in wood and lumber), and farmer. There are also records of his investments in land in Kansas from 1880 to 1900. Joseph C. Burley's estate papers are together at the end of his business papers. Harry Burley was the executor, and this series also contains some early farm records dating from 1900 to 1920.

Photographs in this collection document Harry and Louise Burley's family gatherings, including many family reunions on the Epping property, and their travels.

Series 1. Family papers, 1752-1989

Extent: 45 boxes

Scope and Content: This is a collection of several generations of family letters and papers from the extended Burley and Haley families centered on an Epping, NH, farm that was in the family for over 200 years. Not all family members actually lived on the property. The extended family was truly extended, from many locations in the northeast to California, Texas, Arkansas, Michigan, and Illinois; they wrote news of their lives to each other often. For the most part, it is domestic correspondence between parents and children, siblings, absent husband/fathers to family at home, and courtship letters.

The collection is especially strong in letters between parents and children and siblings between 1870 and 1910. Several of the women received secondary educations, then taught school until they married. While away from home, they kept parents and siblings informed about their activities. The friendships women made with classmates and workmates in their early adult years were often strong and lasting and subsequent correspondence stretched over many years. Women also wrote often to absent siblings about family news, neighborhood happenings, and the household, including care of the ill and childrearing matters. Most of the sons were sent to boarding school and/or away to college; they wrote home often, in turn receiving advice and support (financial and otherwise) from parents and siblings.

Although the letters were written over the course of several wars and economic downturns, there is almost no discussion of the Civil War or World War I, and minimal concern was expressed about the depressions that occurred in the 1870s, 1890s, or 1930s.

Arrangement:

Letters are arranged by surname, then by first name, then in chronological order. Other papers, including financial records and ephemera associated with individuals are in folders following the

letters. Dates on folders are inclusive dates of the correspondence within them. Many folders contain scattered dates over the time period indicated.

Women are always filed under their married name, which is shown in brackets [] when the materials were created before marriage. The husband's name, if known, is indicated after the wife's name. See the appendix for a list of maiden and married names.

Any envelopes that were with letters are in front of the letters they contained. Incoming letters from friends or associates are filed with the recipient, usually in the back of the folder for the relevant year, though when the correspondence was voluminous, incoming letters have been placed in folders filed in the appropriate year. Essays, school papers, poems, etc. are filed under "writings" by the relevant author.

Subseries 1.1. Bartlett, 1844-1942

Extent: 21 folders

Scope and Content: This subseries contains the correspondence of the following Bartlett family members from 1844 to 1942, with unidentified Bartlett family members at the end:

Churchill Bartlett, (1863-1930). Family relationship is unknown, perhaps the son of Zenas Bartlett. He lived in Texas and was Secretary of State there in the early 20th century. His correspondence dates from 1916 to 1918.

Esther Bartlett (1825-1896 or 1897). Wife of Obediah Bartlett. She wrote from Charlestown, possibly MA, to Sarah (Mrs. J.C.) Burley. Her correspondence dates from 1863 to 1896.

Greene C. Bartlett. Dates unknown, relationship to family unknown. He wrote from Derry, NH, to "cousin" Joseph C. Burley with attorney advice. His correspondence dates from 1861 to 1891.

G.K. Bartlett. Name, dates, and relationship to family unknown. Perhaps the son of Greene C. Bartlett. He wrote attorney advice for Joseph C. Burley from Derry, NH, in 1896.

James W. Bartlett (1869-1929). Son of Zenas Bartlett. He wrote from Marlin, TX, on Rush, Gardner & Bartlett Hardware and Furniture stationary. His correspondence dates from 1920 to 1926.

Josiah Bartlett (born 1813). Brother of Zenas Bartlett. He wrote from Garland, ME, from 1880 to 1885.

Lalla Bartlett (1872-1895). Daughter of Zenas Bartlett. She wrote from Marlin, TX, in 1894.

Lydia Bartlett (born 1811). Wife of Nehemiah Bartlett. She wrote from Darlington, WI, to 'Brother and Sister Johnson' about the death of her husband in 1880.

Nathaniel Bartlett. Dates unknown; relationship to family unknown. He wrote from Haverhill, MA, from 1873 to 1882.

Nehemiah Bartlett (died 1880). Brother of Sarah Bartlett Page and husband of Lydia Bartlett. He wrote about his family and health (he was 79) from Darlington, WI, in 1880.

Obediah Bartlett (born 1818). Brother of Sarah Bartlett Page, married to Esther Strand Bartlett. He wrote about his family, business affairs, and descriptions of Atlanta, GA, and Florida. It does not appear that he lived in the south, but traveled there for extended periods on business. His correspondence dates from 1871 to 1885.

Ozella M. Bartlett (1843-1919). Niece of Sarah Bartlett Page. She wrote from Marlin TX, where she lived with her uncle Zenas Bartlett and his family. She taught school and never married. Her correspondence dates from 1859 to 1891.

Samuel Bartlett. Dates unknown; relationship to family unknown. He wrote from Massachusetts from 1882 to 1900.

Silas Conoly Bartlett (1902-1992) and his wife, Tina (Catherine) Beard Bartlett (1903-2002). They wrote from Evanston, IL, from 1936 to 1942.

Victoria Cilley Bartlett (1831-1905). Daughter of Joseph and Elizabeth Williams Cilley. She married Thomas Bradbury Bartlett in 1857, with whom she had six children. She wrote from Haverhill, MA, from 1844 to 1900.

Zenas Bartlett (1819-1897). Brother of Sarah Page Burley. He wrote from Marlin, TX, to his sister and also to his nephew, Andrew Page. His early letters, before 1854, were written from Alabama, Panama, and various places in California, where he was mining for gold. In 1854, he decided to settle in Texas. There are no letters from the Civil War era, but in one from 1868 he defended his pro-slavery, anti-reconstruction position. In 1884, he was still lamenting Civil War losses and effects on Texas economy, including that former slaves don't work as hard now, land values are still depressed, etc. Nevertheless, he sent his daughter, Rosa, north to visit, and his son to college in the north. Rosa Bartlett married James Mullins; her letters are found under that surname.

Subseries 1.2. Burleigh, 1869-1978

Extent: 51 folders

Scope and Content: This subseries contains the correspondence and papers of the following Burleigh family members from 1869 to 1978, with various Burleigh family members at the end:

Arthur Cilley (1891-1976) and Caroline (Kit) Sprague Burleigh (1893-1976). Arthur was the son of Harry W. and Nannie Burley Burleigh. Their correspondence dates from 1894 to 1962, with large gaps between dates.

Harry W. Burleigh (1855-1927). Husband of Nannie Burley Burleigh, whom he married in 1879. He owned Burleigh's Valve Grinder in Franklin, NH, where they lived. They had five sons: Joseph Cilley, who died as a newborn; Nathaniel; Arthur; Thomas, who died at age 14; and another Joseph. His correspondence dates from 1876 to 1911.

Ida Burleigh (1858-1886). Daughter of Wallace Burleigh. Her correspondence dates from 1877 to 1886.

Joseph (1900-1980) and Alice Taggart Burleigh (1904-1994). Joseph was Harry W. and Nannie Burley Burleigh's son. Their correspondence dates from 1920 to 1978.

Elizabeth "Lizzie" Charlotte (L.C.) Burleigh (1857-1925). Daughter of Wallace Burleigh. Her correspondence dates from 1877 to 1910.

Nannie Burley Burleigh (1857-1939). Wife of Harry W. Burleigh. Nannie was the daughter of Joseph C. and Sarah Elizabeth Haley Burley, and the sister of Harry B., Alice, Jane/Jennie, and Benjamin T. She was a graduate of Dean Academy in Franklin, MA. In 1879, she married Harry Walter Burleigh of Franklin, NH, owner of Burleigh's Valve Grinder Manufacturing Company. They had five sons: Joseph, who died as a newborn in 1886; Nathaniel; Arthur; Thomas; and another Joseph. Thomas was killed at age 14, crushed by a falling crane when the rope broke. They lived in Franklin, NH. Her correspondence is dated from 1869 to 1938 and includes numerous incoming letters from Mary Dix, Anna E. Jones, and Louise Pollard. Also included are financial papers, a diary, and ephemera, which includes obituaries for various Burleigh relatives.

Nathaniel (Nat) George Burleigh, 1889-1970. Son of Nannie and Harry Burleigh. Correspondence dates from 1897 to 1951.

Thea Tufts Burleigh (1888-1948). Wife of Nathaniel Burleigh. Her correspondence dates from 1910 to 1944.

Thomas Burleigh. Dates unknown; relationship to family unknown. His papers contain only an 1818 deed for land in Epping, NH.

Various Burleighs. Includes letters, envelopes, and a card from Thomas R., Martha, Rosamond, Keith, and Arthur Burleigh.

Subseries 1.3. Burley, 1787-1968

Extent: 287 folders and 148 volumes

Scope and Content: This subseries contains the correspondence and papers of the following Burley family members from 1787 to 1968:

Burley, Benjamin Captain (1803-1861). Husband of Elizabeth Ann Cilley. He was the son of Thomas Burley (1746-1847) and Nancy Hoit Burley (1778-1814); his only sibling, Joseph, died at age 12. He married Elizabeth Ann Cilley in 1826; they lived in Epping, in what became known as “The Homestead” at 270 North Epping Road. Their children were: Joseph Cilley Burley (1830-1900) and Nancy Jane Burley (1832-1855). They also adopted Jonathan Prince Cilley and Julia Cilley [who married Ellis Lazell], children of Elizabeth’s brother Jonathan Cilley, after his death.

The majority of Captain Burley’s papers are bills and receipts, though there are also a few letters written to his daughter, Nancy Jane, while she was away at school. Incoming letters

are from the maternal relatives of Jonathan (sometimes called “Prin”) and Julia Cilley and have to do with decisions about managing their funds and Jon’s future employment. In his papers are photocopies of deeds made by the donor; the original deeds are in Box 45 under “Burley, various deeds.” His papers date from 1823 to 1875.

Benjamin T. Burley, MD (1874-1956). He was the son of Joseph Cilley Burley and Sarah Elizabeth Haley Burley. His siblings were Nannie Burley Burleigh, Harry B. Burley, Alice Burley Curtis, and Jane/Jennie Cilley Burley. Benjamin T. married Angelyn Jefferds (1881-1977) in 1921; they had no children. Benjamin T. was a graduate of Phillips Exeter Academy (1893), Harvard College (1897), and Harvard Medical School (1901), after which he was a resident at Boston Floating Hospital. He was a neurologist/psychiatrist (in his time they were often practiced together) and lived and practiced in Worcester, MA, before retiring to Cohasset, MA, in 1952.

Most letters in the collection were written early, during his childhood and years at Exeter and Harvard. During his last Harvard years (1895-1897), he was socially very active and there are many letters from young women either inviting him to their events or responding to his invitations to parties, dances, and concerts. They also wrote during the summers about activities at vacation spots in New England and the Adirondacks of upper New York State. The correspondence illustrates the social world of New England upper middle-class young adults in the late 19th century. Burley’s later life and his medical practice, however, are almost completely undocumented in these papers. His papers date from 1881 to 1968.

Elizabeth Ann Cilley Burley (1804-1876). Wife of Captain Benjamin Burley, Elizabeth was the daughter of Greenleaf Cilley (1767-1808) and Jenny Nealley Cilley (1772-1866); her siblings were Greenleaf, Fred, Sarah, and Jonathan, who was killed in a duel and whose children (Jonathan and Julia Cilley) Elizabeth and Captain Benjamin adopted. The couple lived in Epping, in what became known as “The Homestead” at 270 North Epping Road. Their children were Joseph Cilley Burley (1830-1900) and Nancy Jane Burley (1832-1855). Her papers date from 1826 to 1878 and include correspondence, financial papers related to her dowry, and writings such as recipes and cures and treatments for various conditions.

Harry Benjamin Burley (1867-1954). Husband of Louise Wells Burley. Harry B. Burley’s parents were Joseph C. Burley (1830-1900) and Sarah Elizabeth Haley Burley (1833-1912). His siblings were Nannie, Alice, Jane/Jennie, and Benjamin. He attended Dartmouth College, but graduated from MIT, class of 1890. He also attended Bryant and Stratton, a business school in Manchester, NH, in 1884. See oversized box 45 for exercise books he used there. In 1890, he was appointed City Engineer for Nashua, NH, a position he held until 1893, when he was an engineer for the Factory Mutual Insurance Company of Boston, which required travel throughout the east to inspect the factories the company insured. Photographs documenting a few of these visits to Maine and Alabama are in the photograph series: box 88, folder 13. He and Louise married in 1901 and had three sons: Joseph, Robert, and Harry B. Jr. In 1902 he was in an accident while at work which involved hospitalization and a lengthy recovery; correspondence related to this event is among his business records in box 49. Harry B. founded the Boston Insulated Wire Co. in 1905; he and Louise lived in Chestnut Hill, MA.

Like his brother Benjamin, Harry was an eligible bachelor with an active social life during his prep school and college years and his correspondence and ephemera contain many invitations to dances, weddings, and other events. Harry B. Burley also managed the family homestead in Epping, hiring and corresponding with farm managers, paying bills, and buying and selling adjacent property. His sisters Jane/Jennie and Alice lived there; Jane/Jennie all her life and Alice for her final years. These records are found in Series 3 Business Records, Subseries 1 Farm Records.

Harry's business records are found in Series 3, Business Records, Subseries 2 in box 49. There is no material in either his personal papers or business records about the establishment or operation of the Boston Insulated Wire Company. Of note is a treatment chart for when Harry had typhoid in 1900. Although the chart is unsigned, the physician was probably his brother-in-law, William Curtis, and it can be found in box 12, folder 7. His papers date from 1876 to 1954.

Harry Benjamin Burley, Jr. (1912-1998). Son of Harry and Louise Burley. His correspondence dates from 1915 to 1948.

Jane/Jennie Cilley Burley (1872-1962). Addressed as both Jane and Jennie, she was the daughter of Joseph C. and Sarah Haley Burley and sister of Nannie, Harry B., Alice, Benjamin T. She was a graduate of Dean Academy, Franklin, MA, where she made friends with whom she corresponded for many years. Never married, she was active in local civic and political affairs. She lived at 264 North River Road, Epping NH, on property adjacent to "The Homestead," where her parents had lived. Her papers consist of correspondence, financials, and ephemera from 1881 to 1962.

Joseph Cilley Burley (1830-1900). Husband of Sarah Elizabeth Haley, Joseph C. Burley was son of Captain Benjamin Burley and Elizabeth Ann Cilley Burley; his only sibling, Nancy Jane Burley (1832-1855) died of tuberculosis. He married Sarah Elizabeth Haley in 1855; their children were Nannie, Harry B., Alice, Jane/Jennie, and Benjamin T. They lived in "The Homestead" at 270 N. River Road, Epping, NH, where he was a farmer, stationmaster, businessman, etc.

During the Civil War, he received letters from several serving soldiers. Jacob Aul (1863-1866) wrote again and again asking that Burley send him money, apparently his bounty for serving, but had little to say about army life and nothing about battles. William Furber (1864-1865) wrote to Sarah E. Burley, who he addressed as "Cousin," but the letters were kept with the others to her husband. Furber was a clerk at Brigade headquarters in Ft. Richardson, VA, and then in Washington, DC. He described his work as being easy and requiring only 2 hours a day, so he had time for other activities including a visit to the "mansion" of Robert E. Lee in Arlington, VA. There are also two letters of thanks for gifts the Burleys sent to hospitals and a series of almost illegible letters from an unidentified relative.

Most of Joseph Burley's correspondence relates to business and financial matters. He wrote his children when they asked for money, congratulated them on grades, and reported on their

mother's activities. By 1891, letters to his wife and children began to report about his health, with details about physicians' opinions and treatments.

The donor of the Burley and Haley Family Papers separated Joseph C. Burley's business and estate papers from the rest of his materials. His business records are in Series 3, Subseries 3 (boxes 50-81); the estate records are Subseries 3a (boxes 82-84); and business ephemera in Subseries 3b (box 85). His papers date from 1841 to 1900.

Joseph Cilley Burley, Jr. "Joe" (1905-2001). Son of Harry B. and Louise Wells Burley. His papers also contain letters written by his children. His correspondence dates from 1915 to 1964.

Louise Wells Burley [Adelaide Louise Wells Burley] (1878-1955). Harry B. Burley's wife, Louise, was christened Adelaide Louise Wells but was known all her life as Louise. She was to Frank P. Wells and Sarah Page Wells and grew up in Lansing, MI. She was the 6th of 7 children and corresponded frequently with her siblings. She also has correspondence from Helen Josephine "Josie" Cole Neff, with whom Louise visited in Knoxville, TN during her youth. Josie then married Frank C. Neff in 1902 and lived in Kansas City, Mo.

Members of her extended family also lived in western Pennsylvania and various places in the Midwest, especially in DeValls Bluff, AK, where her father had a manufacturing business. She attended Oberlin Academy in Oberlin, OH, a coeducational private secondary school located on the Oberlin College campus. She married Harry Burley in 1901. They lived in Chestnut Hill, MA, and had three sons: Joseph, Robert, and Harry Jr. Box 20, folder 4 contains correspondence from a child Louise Burley "adopted" though *Fatherless Children of France* during World War I. Her papers date from 1887 to 1955.

Nancy Jane Burley (1832-1855). Sister of Joseph Cilley Burley and daughter of Captain Benjamin and Elizabeth Ann Cilley Burley. She died of tuberculosis in 1855, and her files contain many condolence letters. Nancy Jane may have been a teacher. Her letters are from various New Hampshire locations and date from 1846 to 1855.

Robert Maxwell Burley (1907-1990). Son of Harry B. Burley and Louise Wells Burley. His correspondence contains letters from him and his family, dated from 1917 to 1954.

Sarah Elizabeth Haley Burley (1833-1912). Wife of Joseph C., Sarah was the daughter of Samuel Haley (1798-1884) and Sarah Bartlett Haley (1798-1854). In 1855 she married Joseph C. Burley; their children were: Nannie, Harry B., Alice, Jane/Jennie, and Benjamin T. She had many friends and her files document the lives both of herself and of these women. Typical is a long series (1857-1911) from Rosa Brown Ackerman (Mrs. Charles), who Sarah knew when they were both unmarried teachers. Rosa was widowed soon after her marriage and then resumed her teaching career; she wrote about her professional life as well as her off duty activities. Sarah and Joseph lived in the family homestead in Epping. Also included are numerous diaries. Her papers date from 1851 to 1922.

Thomas Burley (1766-1847). Husband of Nancy Hoit (1788-1814), they were married in 1798. They had two children: Joseph, who died at age 12 in 1811, and Benjamin (known above as “Captain” Benjamin Burley). They lived in Epping, NH on what became known as “The Homestead.” His papers consist primarily of financial papers and date from 1787 to 1847.

Scope and Content: This subseries contains the correspondence and papers of the following Cilley family members from 1829 to 1919, with various Cilley members at the end:

Greenleaf Cilley (1829-1899). Brother to Elizabeth Ann Cilley Burley. His correspondence dates from 1840 to 1894, and he writes from New York, NY; Washington, DC; and from various ships off the coast of Florida and Argentina.

Jonathan Cilley (1802-1838). Son of Greenleaf Cilley (1767-1808). He graduated from Bowdoin College in 1825 and was a U.S. Congressman from Maine. Jonathan was killed in a duel by William J. Graves, a fellow congressman. He was the father of Jonathan and Julia, who were adopted by his sister and brother-in-law, Elizabeth Cilley Burley and Captain Benjamin Burley. His papers consist of ephemera regarding his death in 1838.

Jonathan Prince “Prin” Cilley (1835-1920) Son of Jonathan Cilley (1802-1838), nephew and niece of Elizabeth Ann Cilley Burley, who adopted Jonathan and his sister, Julia Cilley (later Mrs. Ellis Lazell), in the early 1850s after his father was killed in 1838 and his mother, Deborah Prince Cilley died in 1844. He married Caroline A. Lazell of Brooklyn, NY, daughter of Warren Lazell and Sophia Thurber in 1866. In 1897 he married his second wife, Mary A. Butler. After graduating from Bowdoin College, he began to practice law but then enlisted in a cavalry unit during the Civil War. Although he was wounded, he served until the end of the war and was discharged with the brevet rank of Brigadier General. After the war, he and his wife lived in Maine, where he served in the state legislature, as adjutant-general of Main, and commissioner of the United States Circuit Court. He and Caroline had two children, Grace and Jonathan Prince, Jr. His correspondence dates from 1850 to 1918. This subseries also contains financial accounts, receipts, and account books related to Jonathan Prince and his sister Julia Cilley Lazell, kept by their guardian, Benjamin Burley, from 1848 to 1864. Julia’s correspondence is located in subseries 1.13 Lazell.

Like her sisters, Alice had many friends from whom she received letters all her life and the correspondence documents the nature of women's friendships in the period. Her papers date from 1879 to 1942.

William Goodman Curtis (1869-1947). Married Alice Burley in 1897, after completing medical education at various New York locations, including Bellevue Hospital. He attended the Massachusetts Institute of Technology with Harry B. Burley. After false starts in some locations, he practiced medicine in Wollaston, MA. Most of his letters were written to his future wife, Alice Burley, and describe his medical training. Alice and William divorced at some point because William later remarried. There are no letters after 1907 or about his medical practice. His letters date from 1889 to 1907.

Winfield Scott Evans (1816-1909). Evans was indentured to Joseph Cilley Burley's grandfather, Thomas Burley, and it is likely that Joseph Burley knew Evans during his childhood. Evans and his wife (Sarah Langley Evans, died 1880) moved west, where he became a currier and farmer in the Chicago, IL, area. His many letters to Joseph discuss farming, what the agricultural markets were like and therefore what to plant, his sale and purchase of land, and the health and activities of his wife and son. Joseph C. Burley apparently lent money to Evans and may also have advised him in his real estate ventures. The Evans family visited the Burleys in New Hampshire and they in turn visited the Illinois farm. Evans' son also corresponded with the Joseph Cilley family. See oversize box 45, folder 12 for the original 1825 indenture of "Winfield Scott Evans, pauper," to Thomas Burley of Epping. His papers date from 1831 to 1906 and are predominately from Arlington and Princeton, IL.

Ezekiel seems to have travelled much of the time on business, for his letters to Sarah were from many locations. Ezekiel died of tuberculosis while looking for land in Florida to purchase and settle on. He was apparently overcome by the heat while walking some vacant land and was found by neighbors. They had five children including Andrew Jackson Page. There is reference in some letters to a Franklin Page (1848-1883), perhaps a son, who died in Ohio; "Freddy," who died in 1867, was also mentioned in a few letters. Their daughter, Sarah (1839-1900) married Franklin P. Wells, and one of their daughters was Adelaide Louise Wells, who married Harry B. Burley. Ezekiel and Sarah Page's papers date from 1832 to 1881.

Franklin Page. Dates unknown; possibly the son of Ezekiel and Sarah Page. His papers consist of an undated volume of school notes.

Page, Various. Includes correspondence and ephemera from several Page family members, including John (1819-1889), Amanda (born 1841), Lyman (born 1854), and Enoch Winslow (1824-1889). The materials date from 1851 to 1923.

The extended family of Louise Wells Burley (Mrs. Harry B.) lived in the mid-west, especially in DeValls Bluff, AK, but also in Cleveland and California. The following family members are included in this subseries:

Charles Frederick (1867-1923) and Alice Sutcliffe Wells (1870-1951). Brother of Louise Wells Burley and part of the family business (they manufactured boat oars) in DeValls Bluff, AK. Their correspondence dates from 1889 to 1946.

Claire Pruyn Wells (1883-1944). Sister-in-law to Louise Wells Burley and married to Frank P. Wells, Jr., who died in 1936. Louise and Harry Burley seem to have helped her financially, for many of the letters are thanks for money. Claire was widowed during the depression of the 1930s and wrote extensively about how she and her son were managing. She worked in and eventually bought a dress shop; photos of it are included in correspondence in folder 5. She wrote from Maricopa and Costa Mesa, CA, from 1912 to 1944.

Clara B. Wells (1882-1930). Sister to Louise Wells Burley. She wrote from various Wells locations: Buffalo, DeValls Bluff, and Cleveland. Her correspondence dates from 1888 to 1920.

Emma Sibley Wells (1857-1950). Stepmother of Louise Wells Burley and second wife of Frank P. Wells. Prior to her marriage to Frank Wells in 1900, she acted as housekeeper and helper to Wells' first wife, Sarah Page. She lived first in Buffalo, NY, but by 1912 was in Rivera, CA, where she managed the last years of the care of Frank P. Wells until his death in 1913. After his death, she relocated to Lansing, MI. Her correspondence dates from 1889 to 1947.

Franklin ("Frank") Parker Wells (1836-1913). Father of Louise Wells Burley and husband of Sarah Page Wells. His correspondence includes courting letters to her written from Lundy's Lane and then Albion, PA. Sarah Page Wells died in 1901, and Frank P. later married Emma Sibley. See his autobiography covering the years 1857-1902 for details about his business in box 42, folder 14. He wrote from DeValls Bluff, AK; then Buffalo, NY; and finally, from Hollywood, CA, where he died. His papers date from 1861 to 1916.

Franklin Parker Wells, Jr. (1874-1936). Brother of Louise Wells Burley and married to Claire Pruyne Wells. Born in Lansing, MI, he graduated from Harvard Law School, lived and wrote from DeValls Bluff, AK, and retired to California. Had two children, Elizabeth Pruyne Wells and Frank P. Wells III. His papers date from 1886 to 1934.

Judson Wells [Adoniram Judson Wells] (1864-1936) and his wife, Jennie. Uncle and aunt of Louise Wells Burley; he was the brother of her father, Frank P. Wells. They lived in Buffalo, NY, until retiring to California. Their papers date from 1864 to 1934.

Julius Wells (1872-1931). Louise Wells Burley's brother. He married Haidee Elder in 1898. They lived in DeValls Bluff, AK. Their letters date from 1876 to 1929.

Louisa Cole Wells (1813-1896). Mother of Frank P. Wells and grandmother of Louise Wells Burley. She wrote from Lundy's Lane, PA, from 1864 to 1882.

Sarah Page Wells (1839-1900). Wife of Frank P. Wells, daughter of Sarah Bartlett and Ezekiel Page, and mother of Louise Wells Burley. Her early letters were written from Platea, PA. In 1854 she wrote from The Mechanics Institute in New York, where she seems to have been staying with an aunt and her sister, Amanda. In 1860 she was in Lockport, PA, though the rest of the family was elsewhere, for she wrote many letters about managing their move. For example, she asked her mother if she should sell or pack a variety of items from "the tavern." In early 1861, however, she was still in Lockport staying with her uncle and aunt, who were pressed for money, but Frank Wells asked to "pay his address" to her. Shortly thereafter, she stayed with Mrs. Wells and talked about how much she had learned about being self-reliant, though she was not sure she felt anything for Frank (who was off teaching somewhere). In the spring of 1861, she joined her parents in Widder, Ontario, Canada. Frank proposed that August and they married in December. Her letters in 1870s were from MI, near Lansing. By 1880, Frank was manufacturing Page's Oars, Sweeps and Sculls and at some point, they moved to DeValls Bluff, AK. In the 1880s her health was failing and she wrote from several resorts and spas. The ephemera includes an 1872 prescription for behavior and medications ("exercise carefully" etc.) and Lansing (MI) Women's Club programs. Her papers date from 1853 to 1899.

Series 3. Business records, 1838-1976

Extent: 37 boxes

Scope and Content: This series has been divided into three subseries by the donor. Researchers are advised to also consult related personal papers, as the division between “personal” and “business” was sometimes loose. The materials in this series include farm records, business records of Joseph C. Burley and Harry B. Burley, estate papers, and business ephemera, dating from 1838 to 1976.

Subseries 3.1. Farm records, 1882-1976

Extent: 25 folders

Scope and Content: The Burley and Haley family farm, known as “The Burley Homestead,” was in Epping, NH, and remained in the family from the original purchase in 1752 to the early 21st century. Joseph Cilley Burley and his wife, Sarah Elizabeth Haley Burley, lived there from 1861 until his death in 1900. In 1883 the farm consisted of 265 acres, of which 10 were cultivated and the rest used as pasture or woodlot. Burley, a man of wide interests, also had a lumbering business, was a Selectman and County Commissioner, was president of two local banks, and helped organize the Nashua & Rochester Railroad, which ran through the farm.

Joseph C. Burley’s unmarried daughter, Jennie (or Jane) (1872-1962) lived on the farm her entire life and her sister, Alice Burley Curtis (1870-1946), is said by the donor to have spent her final years there as well. Their brother, Harry B. Burley (1867-1954), was responsible for managing and maintaining the farm, and the letters and financial records in this series were written to or by him.

The farm property acreage waxed and waned over time; there were always at least two and sometimes more primary dwellings. In 1928 Harry B. Burley added “Riverslea Farm,” formerly occupied by a relative, and in 1933 he acquired the old Haley House, where his mother had been born. These were sold after his death in 1954, but the nearby Warren Farm was added to the property.

When the records were created, mostly in the 1930s, the family member responsible for running the farm, Harry B. Burley, lived in Massachusetts. Therefore, the farmers doing the work kept

diaries of their activities and wrote letters explaining farm production, repairs, and expenses. While some years are fully documented, others are scattered and for some records, it is unknown when or by whom they were written. Nevertheless, they offer a day-to-day view of the labor itself, illnesses and behavior of the employees, their work histories, and sometimes information about their families. The financial papers include ledger sheets, which have the names and pay of farm employees.

Additional farm records from an earlier period, 1900-1917, are among the estate records of Joseph C. Burley. These are found in series 3, subseries 3a, box 82. See also Harry Burley's personal papers and business records.

Subseries 3.2. Burley, Harry, 1890-1939

Extent: 19 folders

Scope and Content Note: In 1890 Harry Burley was appointed City Engineer for Nashua, NH, a position he held until 1893, though he seems to have continued his relationship with Nashua as his business records also contain a long report he produced for the city's sewage commission in 1898 about sewage flowing into the Nashua River. He was then employed by Factory Mutual Insurance Company of Boston, MA, work that required travel throughout the east to inspect the factories the company insured. He was injured while on the job in late May or early June, 1902; his business papers for the period all concern his hospitalization and recovery from the incident. There is, however, no description of the actual accident or how it happened. Some of the correspondence is to his wife, inquiring about his recovery. The subseries also includes correspondence from the insurance company regarding an automobile accident. Burley founded the Boston Insulated Wire Co. in 1905 and ran it for the rest of his life, but no activities or papers related to that firm are among his business records or personal papers.

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Subseries 3.3. Burley, Joseph C., 1838-1905

Extent: 441 folders and 102 volumes

Scope and Content Note: Joseph C. Burley (1830-1900) was a farmer, local politician, dealer in lumber and wood, and investor in railroads, banks, and land in Kansas. These activities are comingled among his business papers.

His wood and lumber career began in the late 1870s; by 1880 his letterhead indicated he was in business with W.N. Dow of Exeter, NH. This business involved sourcing wood of various kinds (hardwoods, pine) from woodlots, some of which he owned, but he also bought standing wood from others to then cut. He was a middleman: he found saw mills to cut the logs into boards of specified lengths and thicknesses and had them delivered to his customers, who were manufacturers of boxes, picture frames, furniture, baskets, etc. His files contain notes of payments made to workers (lumbermen, sawyers), invoices to railroads (often queries about the whereabouts of a particular car), and to his customers (who complained when the deliveries were

late or the lumber not as specified). He organized his business life in a series of small memo books, recording wood cut in various lots, debts incurred, loans made, purchases, and sales.

Joseph C. Burley's political life began at a young age: he was elected to the School Committee at the age of 21. He was an Epping Selectman and Rockingham County Commissioner (1879-1881), Epping Town Auditor (1884-1885), Justice of the Peace (1877, 1882, 1887), and served in the State Legislature (1883). During his tenure as county commissioner, he was responsible for the institution that cared for aged, infirm, and/or indigent citizens; the records of which contain letters discussing some cases of need as well as pleas for more supplies.

His involvement in railroads were ongoing, beginning when he was station agent for the Boston and Maine Railroad in Newmarket (1855-1861) and continuing as he helped organize the Nashua and Rochester Railroad, whose track ran through his property. Later, he was a director of the railroad.

His business interests also included banking: he was President of the Newmarket Savings Bank (1885-1892), as well as a founder and President of the Epping Savings Bank (1892-1898). Beginning in the 1880s, he began to invest in loans to farmers in Kansas as well as in land there. At the end of his life, most of his business records concern these western investments which he made through a firm called Crippen, Lawrence Investment Co., located first in Chicago, IL, and later in Denver, CO. He may have known one of the founders of the company, for there are occasional letters from a J.F. Lawrence of Chicago beginning in the late 1870s.

Joseph C. Burley's estate records were separated by the donor and are at the end of his business records, though some estate material also remains with the business records. The farm records from the early 20th century are also among the estate records, probably because Harry Burley, his son, was his executor and also ran the farm. See series 3, subseries 1 for more farm records.

Burley's business records contain personal bills for horses, machines, boats, occasionally food, and clothing. The few items of personal correspondence include a group of letters from and about a Maggie Burley (1892-1894, box 74, folder 7), a foundling who was accidentally separated from her parents when she was 4 or 5 and was searching for family connections.

Burley did not serve in the Civil War. See Box 16, folders 5-8 for letters from men he paid to serve in his place.

Joseph C. Burley's business records are arranged in chronological order, with correspondence, bills and receipts together by year and month, as Burley left them. Occasionally he put items relating to a subject together in envelopes or tied with string; these have been left as found. Beginning in the 1890s, he frequently filed correspondence with the Crippen, Lawrence Investment Co., the firm handling his Western investments, separately; much of it tied together in bundles within bundles. Contents of the bundles have been filed together.
