Abstract:

This collection contains five account books of treasurer's records, *A Book of Memory* containing lists of deceased members, minutes of executive board meetings, and miscellaneous letters of resignation. Records were created by various people who held the positions of treasurer and secretary for the organization.

The Episcopal Diocese of New Hampshire Women's Auxiliary Records were purchased by the New Hampshire Historical Society on September 21, 2012.

Processing Information:

This collection was processed by Suzanne Huggard in November 2012. The finding aid was written by Suzanne Huggard in November 2012 and revised by Rebecca Enman in January 2013. This finding aid follows the standards set forth by *Describing Archives: A Content Standard*.

Collection Overview

Administrative Information:

The Episcopal Diocese of New Hampshire Women's Auxiliary was a statewide organization affiliated with the National Episcopal Church. The organization's focus was missions work, charitable outreach, and providing a social structure for female members of local churches. Information available from the New Hampshire Episcopal Diocese contains no mention of the Women's Auxiliary, and it is unknown whether the organization existed after 1963. A notation in *A Book of Memory* references an organizational meeting date of 1888.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Episcopal Diocese of New Hampshire Women's Auxiliary Records consist of miscellaneous papers, including letters of resignation; one page from the *Book of Memory* dated 1963; an additional list of deceased in Keene, NH, undated; and a schedule of financial expectations dated

1961. Also included are minutes of the executive board meetings from 1936 to 1951, five ledger books of treasurer's records from 1917 to 1942, and *A Book of Memory* consisting of yearly listings of deceased members by parish with an occasional narrative tribute dated 1929 to 1963. While not all towns appear in every volume, a compilation of participating parish names and towns include:
