Abstract:

The Bill Finney Photograph Collection consists of approximately 10,511 film negatives and transparencies, with occasional prints and notes, of images taken by well-known photographer Bill Finney between 1957 and 2012, with a number of images undated. This collection predominately focuses on politics in New Hampshire, thoroughly documenting the activities of many New Hampshire governors, senators, representatives, and presidential hopefuls. It also includes images on New Hampshire courts, houses, notable locations, landscapes, museums, and events.

Acquisition Information and Provenance:

The Bill Finney Photograph Collection was a gift of Alden J. Finney on February 15, 2013.

Processing Information:

This collection was processed by Carl Peterson, Christopher Moore, and Megan Mullins between 2013 and 2019. Processing was completed and the order finalized by Korrena Cowing from March 2020 to June 2022. The finding aid was written by Korrena Cowing in June 2022. This finding aid follows the standards set forth by *Describing Archives: A Content Standard*.

All materials in this collection were moved into acid-free sleeves and the item/folder titles were copied onto these sleeves from their original folders. Misspellings and abbreviations were retained in the folder title per the original folders they were in. Correct spellings have been included in brackets when necessary.

The collection is housed at the New Hampshire Historical Society in Concord, New Hampshire.

Physical Characteristics and Technical Requirements:

The bulk of the materials in this collection are film negatives and transparencies and require the use of a lightbox for viewing. All materials should remain in their mylar sleeves when being handled. Two CDs of images are included in this collection and require the use of a computer with a CD/DVD drive for viewing. Copies of these images have been moved to the digital archive for preservation.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information:

William "Bill" E. Finney was born in Concord, NH, on September 19, 1931 to Elliott and Claire (Jordan) Finney. He went to St. John High School and graduated from the Progressive School of Photography in New Haven, CT, in 1949. Finney later received several certificates in commercial photography.

A well-known photographer, Finney did commercial work for national and local magazines and newspapers, including working as a photographer for the *Concord Monitor* and as the official photographer for the biannual New Hampshire House Legislature "class picture" from 1962 to 2005. In addition, he took numerous photographs of New Hampshire as well as photographs for museum and historical societies, including of objects at the New Hampshire Historical Society. Presented with several awards and distinctions for his photography, his work was also included in exhibitions, particularly those showcasing New Hampshire and Ireland.

Finney served in the U.S. Army from 1951 to 1954, during the Korean War. He married first Elaine R. Yager, with whom they had three children: Douglas, Peter, and Matthew. He married second Alden Johnson. He lived in Concord and Hopkinton, NH, before moving to Diamond Cove, ME. Finney often traveled to Ireland, where he held a dual citizenship. He returned to Concord in his later years, passing away at Concord Hospital on September 5, 2016 after a brief illness.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Bill Finney Photograph Collection is a large collection of approximately 10,511 items consisting predominately of black and white film negatives of local politics, politicians, and political events in Concord, NH. These are primarily images of New Hampshire governors and their activities, such as signing proclamations, presenting awards, and meeting with various societies, businesses, and associations. Other political images include meetings of political parties and images of senators, representatives, and presidential hopefuls at events in the state.

This collection also includes color negatives, color transparencies, and a few prints, notes, letters, and additional documents. Other subjects include New Hampshire locations, interiors and exteriors of houses, events, museums and museum objects, landscapes, and businesses. The materials in this collection provide an overview of life in New Hampshire from 1957 to 2012, with the bulk of images dating from the late 1950s through the early 1980s. There are also several images in this collection that are undated.

While the majority of images are of political activities at the New Hampshire State House and other locations in Concord, this collection also includes images of houses, events, businesses, museums, and locations from numerous towns across New Hampshire. Images of locations or buildings are mostly identified by building name, town, or street address. However, images of people, particularly groups of people, largely only identify the most prominent subject (i.e. politicians, artists, etc.).

Notable people represented in this collection include: Styles Bridges, James Cleveland, Norris Cotton, Gerald Ford, Lotte Jacobi, Lyndon B. Johnson, Frank Kenison, John F. Kennedy, Rose Kennedy, Chester Merrow, Nelson Rockefeller, Warren Rudman, Alan Shepard, David Souter, and Gerry Williams.

New Hampshire governors represented include: Sherman Adams, Robert O. Blood, Lane Dwinell, Hugh Gallen, Hugh Gregg, Judd Gregg, John W. King, Stephen Merrill, Walter Peterson, Wesley Powell, John Sununu, and Meldrim Thomson.

Notable places in this collection include: Strawberry Banke, the Pierce Manse, the New Hampshire State House, Northwood Lake, Lake Winnipesaukee, the MacDowell Colony, Rockingham Park, the Currier Museum of Art, and Daniel Webster's birthplace.

The photographs were kept in the original groups they were donated in, which are arranged roughly by subject, but there is a substantial amount of overlap between the series. For example, the bulk of the images of Governor John W. King are in Series 9, but images of him at events can also be found in Subseries 4.1., Subseries 4.4., Subseries 4.6., Series 6, and Subseries 12.1. Another example is the Currier Museum of Art, which can be found in Series 3, Series 6, Subseries 12.2., Subseries 13.1., and Subseries 14.2. Subjects also overlap in many of the series. For example, New Hampshire places/locations is used specifically in the title of Series 1, Series 12, and Series 13, but the subject itself includes many of the other series in this collection as well.

An item-level title content list has been provided below to assist in searching for specific people, locations, or subjects. All negatives in the list below are black and white unless otherwise noted. Further details about each series can be found in the series/subseries scope and content notes below.

Within each series, the materials have been organized chronologically, with undated items at the end. Lists of the items in each series in their original order are located in the accession file. Any undated items or items with identical dates remain in the order in which they were found. Each negative sleeve has been given a number starting at .1 and continuing through the entire collection. The number of negatives in each sleeve varies due to the sizes of the negatives and transparencies.

In the contents list below, only the item number is listed. This runs from .1-.2036. On the folders, the full accession number is listed. For example, in the finding aid you will see number ".455" and on the corresponding folder it will be listed as "S 2013.020.455".

Extent: 1 color negative and 82 color transparencies

Scope and Content: This series contains color transparencies and negatives of buildings, businesses, landscapes, and events across New Hampshire. Locations include Antrim, Concord, Hopkinton, the Isles of Shoals, Northwood Lake, Portsmouth, Rye, Lake Winnipesaukee, and more. Some of the businesses include the Gould Hill Apple Orchard, the

New Hampshire Historical Society, the New Hampshire State House, Pierce Manse, Strawberry Banke, and the Woodman House. Though dating from 1970 to 1987, the bulk of the images in this series are undated.

Extent: 190 negatives, 38 color negatives, and 2 color transparencies

Scope and Content: This series consists of images dated between 1957 and 2000 of political events, events at the New Hampshire State House, portraits of politicians, state buildings, and buildings around Park Street in Concord, NH. Both Democratic and Republican events are included. Other events include Memorial Day services, repairs to the State House eagle, and dioramas on display. The majority of images were taken of or at the New Hampshire State House, which is listed as both the State House and the Capitol Building.
