

Correspondence of William H. Alexander to Horace G. Chase

brief notations

1. 15 Dec 1879  
death of Whitney, a carriage builder; Dr. Savoy (?) wood lots; Charlie at Custom House - will leave?; 'Col' Stevens - ite shop still runs, colonel lively as ever
2. 2 June 1881  
L.D. Stearns - will of someone in Peckett's safe; Chandler - legacies in Hopkinton; election today
3. 2 Feb 1882  
birth of daughter 1 Feb
4. 19 June 1882  
Horace still in Chicago; sale of North Evanston house o.k.; sorry of news of Charlie, family with him?; making hopeful plans for Horace to visit with family; Alex will arrange transportation; hopes they will stay at his "tavern"; big shower in front of depot and put 6 feet of water in cellar
5. 10 Jan 1883  
Paid on notes; Mrs. Judith Morse note \$15; S.B. cash; storm - have travelled it all; likes new position much better than fireman position, not so monotonous and more business in it
6. 8 Feb 1883  
death of Charlie's wife (Bell); Charlie recovered
7. 25 May 1883  
having 2 seater carriage painted; turned down RR job in Boston at \$1500 for 1st year, \$2,000 for second; only \$200 more than present
8. 28 May 1883  
Porblems with insurance company; discussion of buying carriages and wagons; sold Hopkinton buggy, bought 2 seater and 4 seater; yours too heavy for stable here; what is the weight; attending to fires along RR line
9. 17 June 1883  
Capt (?) \_\_\_ Abbot shipped your 'Tally Ho' last night; need statements of transactions up to dissolution of firm Chase & Adams; have few notes belonging to me; they should be somewhere
10. 7 Sept 1883  
Come to visit; careful of pick pockets and burglars; N.E. Fair in Manchester for 4 days; Wednesday night Concord post office safe was bored into and \$2300 collateral, keys to all mail locks in the U.S., etc.
11. 7 Jan 1884  
personal business and health; paid Judith Morse \$15 so she wouldn't bring suit; letter from Mr. Gardiner - note at State House that 'Horace Chase, Esq. was elected Asst. Clerk of the House in 1830-31 and 32'; no one knows if it was your father but probably was

12. 28 Jan 1884

Admonish him to give up smoking; if you are going to Chucago in spring,  
can you unload our real estate; no word of Chicago & Evanston RR, did  
it go along or bust?

13. Dec 1879
