Abstract:

Papers, 1905-1994, of Bernard L. Boutin who served as Mayor of Laconia, NH, Deputy Administrator and Administrator of the General Services Administration, Executive Vice-President of the National Association of Home Builders, Deputy Director of the Office of Economic Opportunity, Administrator of the Small Business Association, executive at Sanders Associates, President of St. Michael's College, and an executive vice president of Vermont Savings Bank. Boutin also worked as campaign coordinator of New Hampshire for John F. Kennedy's 1960 presidential campaign.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information/ Administrative Information:

Bernard Boutin was born on July 2, 1923 in Laconia, NH. Boutin graduated first in his class from St. Michael's College in Winooski, VT in 1945. From 1955 until 1959, he served as mayor of Laconia. In 1958 and 1960, Boutin was New Hampshire's Democratic nominee for Governor. Boutin also assisted in John F. Kennedy's campaign for President in 1960 in the New Hampshire Primary and as campaign coordinator for New Hampshire. Following John F. Kennedy's election to President, Boutin was chosen as Deputy Administrator of the General Services Administration in 1961. He then went out to become Administrator of the General Services Administration in November of 1961 and held the position until 1964. During this time, Boutin served on several committees including the First Lady's Committee for a More Beautiful Capital, the President's Committee for Equal Employment Opportunity, and the President's Advisory Council of the Arts.

Boutin worked as Vice President of the National Association of Home Builders until President Lyndon Johnson named him as Deputy Director of the Office of Economic

Opportunity. In 1966, he was named Administrator of the Small Business Association. He returned to New Hampshire in 1967, where he worked at Sanders and Associates, an electronics firm in Nashua. From 1969 until 1974, he served as President of St. Michael's College, which admitted women for the first time under his administration. After leaving St. Michael's, Boutin worked at the Burlington Savings Bank until his retirement in 1980. Bernard Boutin was married to Alice (Boucher) Boutin with whom he had 11 children. Bernard Boutin died on August 24, 2011.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Bernard L. Boutin Papers, 1905-1994, consist of materials related to the personal and professional life of Bernard L. Boutin. There are a small number of materials from Boutin's personal life. The papers include materials from most of Boutin's professional careers, but the majority of papers date from Boutin's time working for the General Services Administration, 1961-1964. Types of materials found in the collection include correspondence, programs, invitations, speeches, printed material, ephemera, and photographs. Notable correspondents include John G. Winant, John F. Kennedy, Jacqueline Kennedy, Lyndon B. Johnson, Lady Bird Johnson, J. Edgar Hoover, Herbert Humphrey, John McCormack, Edward Muskie, and other United States Congressmen.
