

CHARLES WARREN BREWSTER (1802-1868)

Biographical information

Born Portsmouth, N.H. Sept 13, 1802; died there Aug. 3, 1868. Journalist. Began apprenticeship in 1818 in office of the Portsmouth Journal; became sole proprietor in 1834; connected with the paper for more than 50 years. Served several terms in the legislature and was a member of the State Constitutional Convention in 1850-51. He is the author of "Fifty Years in a Printing Office" and "Rambles about Portsmouth".

Scope and Content

The papers are chiefly Whig party political correspondence, 1837-1853. Brewster was Secretary of the Portsmouth Clay Club in 1844 and was a member of the Whig Central Committee, when Asa McFarland was president in 1845. There is a folder of correspondence with lecturerers for the Portsmouth Lyceum, 1839-1843. There is a Journal kept 1818-1825, giving personal expenses and activities, brief but well written.
