Abstract:

These diaries and account books record the work and travels of Levi Call (1847-1916) in Dunbarton and Concord, NH. He owned a farm, was a pump repairer for the Water Commissioners in Concord, moved and built several buildings, lent money, and traveled across the United States from June, 1884 to June, 1885.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information

Levi Call (1847-1916) was married to Mary Ann (died 1921). As a young man, he lived in Dunbarton (Page's Corner), NH; later he and Mary Ann lived in Concord. He worked for the Water Commissioners in Concord as a pump repairer and is listed in the 1860 Concord City Directory as a building mover. He built two dwellings on Mills St, Concord (now Spruce St), where they resided after 1880. The diaries record farm work in Dunbarton and later on a purchased farm known as "The Boulders" in Hopkinton. He did a variety of work for ready cash, which included road work, and frequently loaned money. He traveled across the United States from June, 1884 to June, 1885, making observations throughout.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Levi Call Papers, 1848-1915, contains 56 volumes of diaries ranging from 1857 to 1912. The diaries include information about his personal and business life as well as his observation from travels across the United States made from June 1884 to 1885. The collection also includes twelve volumes of cash accounts, which are good summaries of personal expenditure including balances from numerous band accounts throughout the state, rents collected, yearly personal inventories, tool purchases, and cash given to his wife. A specific volume "Sundry Accounts" includes records of labor and material for a stable on Essex Street, the buildings on Mills Street (Spruce Street), a house on Rumford Street, and a farm (location not identified).

Arrangement:

The diaries and account books are in bound volumes. The author wrote chronologically.
