#### Collection Overview

#### **Administrative Information:**

Capital City Barracks, Concord, NH was chartered about 1953 as Barrack #618 of the Veterans of World War I of the U.S.A., Inc. The purpose of the Capital City Barracks was to assist veterans and their widows with pensions, hospitalization, nursing care, visits to the sick and services for deceased members. It also provided a network for social contacts and communications among veterans.

The 103<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Veterans Association of the Yankee Division was a social organization which held annual reunions alternately in New Hampshire and Maine. It also provided benefit information and held memorial services.

### **Collection Scope and Content Note:**

This collection is divided into two series. The Capital City Barracks series contains material from the Capital City Barracks, which was Barrack #618 of the Veterans of World War I of the U.S.A. and consists mainly of membership information, meeting minutes, correspondence, financial information, and items relating to the Veterans of World War I, USA, Inc.
