Abstract:

These papers, 1833-1846, of Henry Carroll and Nathaniel Baker are mainly related to their time as owners of the *New Hampshire Patriot*, the state's foremost Democratic paper. The collection mainly consists of correspondence with some rough drafts for editorials and items related to their state printing assignments.

Collection Overview

Administrative Information:

Henry Carroll and Nathaniel Baker owned the *New Hampshire Patriot*, the state's foremost Democratic paper, from 1841 to 1846. Prior to that time, the *Patriot* had been owned by Isaac Hill and Cyrus Barton. Hill left the paper in 1829 when he was appointed to a post in the Department of Treasury, and in 1840, Henry Carroll joined Barton. Barton sold his interest to Nathaniel B. Baker in 1841. When Carroll died in 1846, the Patriot was sold to Joseph Merriam and John Hill, the son of Isaac Hill. Carroll and Baker were also selected as state printers and, in the early 1840's, printed statutes and other official items for the state of New Hampshire.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

Henry Carroll and Nathaniel Baker owned the *New Hampshire Patriot*, the state's foremost Democratic paper, from 1841-1846. Carroll and Baker were also selected as state printers and, in the early 1840's printed statutes and other official items for the state

of New Hampshire. This collection contains letters from Democratic office holders, letters to the editor, rough drafts for editorials in the *Patriot*, items relating to their state printing assignments, and letters to Charles T. Jackson, New Hampshire's state geologist. Most of the correspondence is from 1840-1845, with a few letters from the 1830's. The major themes reflected in the collection concern the Radical and Conservative split within the Democratic party, and the turmoil caused by John Parker Hale's denunciation of the Texas annexation.

Arrangement:

The collection is chronologically arranged. Boxes 1, 2, and 3 contain correspondence dated 1833-1846. Box 4, folder 1, contains the Charles T. Jackson correspondence, 1843-1844; Jackson was New Hampshire's state geologist. Box 4, folder 2, contains undated correspondence.

Box 4, folders 3, 4, 5, and 6 contain a range of miscellaneous material, including items relating to the Democratic party, Henry Clay, William Henry Harrison and Martin Van Buren. Folder 4 in Box 4 contains newspaper clippings on Isaac Hill. Folder 5 contains an Account Book.
