JOSEPH DOE FILES
BIOGRAPHICAL PROFILE

Joseph Doe was the father of Charles Doe, onetime Chief Justice of the NH Supreme Court. He was born November 15, 1776 in Newmarket, N.H. and lived there most of his life after marrying the daughter of Captain Ebenezer Richie. He lived in Derry, N.H. for a short while, where his son Charles was born, but returned to Newmarket where he resided for the rest of his life. He died February 28, 1860

Though not an attorney, he wrote many legal documents, filled many offices of trust, was representative of Newmarket to the General Court, and was frequently consulted by fellow townsmen on matters of importance. He was a large land owner and successful farmer.
