BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

Bradbury Jewell was the eldest son of preacher Mark Jewell who had settled in Durham. At age sixteen he was hired by Jonathan Moulton to survey the New Hampshire wilderness between the Sandwich Range and the Ossipee Mountains. In 1771 he began a farming in Tamworth. He served as a militia Captain in the Revolutionary War and held town offices including Justice of the Peace. In 1784 Bradbury Jewell swapped his Tamworth farm for Colonel Thomas Stevenson's Durham farm. He was active in the community and served as a mediator during the dispute between the church and its pastor Curtis Coe. In 1802 he returned to Sandwich/Tamworth area. Mark Freeman Jewell was the son of Bradbury Jewell.
