Abstract:

The Kent Family Diaries is comprised of the journals of Jacob Kent (1726-1812) and the diaries of Richard Peabody Kent (1805-1885). Jacob's journals, 17555-1796, describe military campaigns and accounting lists of goods procured and sold. Richard's diaries, 1843-1885, describe his daily life including important political events and news from the Civil War.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information/ Administrative Information:

Jacob Kent was born in 1726. He was one of the early settlers of Newbury, VT. He served in military campaigns under Captain John Hazzen during the French and Indian War. Kent also served in the military during the American Revolution, specifically the Saratoga Campaign. Jacob Kent also boarded horses, oxen, sheep, and cows at his home. His journals suggest he was also involved in logging. He died in 1812.

Richard Peabody Kent was born on December 21, 1805. He lived most of his life in Lancaster, NH, where he worked as a merchant. Richard Kent was engaged in his community and kept detailed notes on his life in his diaries, which he maintained until his death on March 30, 1885.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Kent Family Diaries contain the journals of Jacob Kent kept between 1775 and 1796 and the diaries of Richard P. Kent kept between 1845 and 1885. Jacob Kent wrote about

his daily life and work. In 1760, he recorded information about military campaigns in which he took part under Captain John Hazzen. He lists the members of his regiment and the supplies they carried. Kent's diaries also discuss his accounts and the beginning construction of the town of Newbury, VT.

Richard Peabody Kent kept his diaries between 1843 and 1885. His diaries discuss various aspects of his daily life in Lancaster, NH. He frequently refers to his wife, Emily. For many years, he records the descriptive statistics on the town. Kent makes note of local events, national events, and some international events. Kent writes about the nomination of presidents and governors. His two sons served in the Civil War, and Kent wrote about many of the battles and campaigns. Kent dictated the last few entries of the diary to his son before his death in March 1885. Summaries of the diaries written by the processor are in folders preceding the diaries.

Arrangement:

The Kent Family Diaries are organized according to author and then chronologically. Jacob Kent's diaries are followed by Richard Peabody Kent's diaries.
