 Education: Dartmouth College, Hanover, N.H. 1837  
 Passed bar exam 1841  
 Settled in Exeter 1841  
 Elected to N.H. Legislature beginning 1845  
 Elected to U.S. House of Representative 1859-63, 1865-67  
 Elected to U.S. Senate 1889-90  
 Commissioned Colonel in 2nd N.H. Volunteers; resigned Brigadier  
 General 20 April 1865  
 Died: 3 July 1890, unmarried
