Joseph and Jeremiah Mooney

Accounts, 1813-1833. 1 folder
Brothers - detailed accounts of building Joseph's house, 1823 and Jeremiah's house, 1827. Alton, N.H.

Joseph Mooney

Diaries, 1826-1865. 19 volumes
Topics addressed are farming, especially the cultivation of apples, grafting, also lumbering, the Wentworth steam mill for sawing lumber, the steamboats, the coming of the railroad, aqueducts for the farm, elections, etc.

Daniel M. Mooney

Diaries, 1830-1832, 1834. 2 volumes in one folder
Brother of Joseph Mooney, went to Rochester as a storekeeper in 1832; moved to Dover on Feb. 9, 1834.

Charles C. Mooney

Diaries, 1834-1908. 30 volumes
Son of Joseph Mooney. Diary begins in school days, continues into old age. Farmer and owner of shoe shop in Alton. Gives election returns. Summary December 31st of every year gives prices of everything

Birch Island House

Record, 1858-1883. 1 volume
Sporting Club, chiefly 1872-1877. Accounts of construction, names of guests, log of events. Daniel M. Mooney was a member of this club

G.C. Hazelton, Fish House

Legal Notes, November 26th, 1859. 1 volume
This is probably George C. Hazelton (1832-1922), a Congressman from Wisconsin who was born in Chester, N.H. and died there.

Notebook

1 volume, contains list of furniture, 1869; household accounts, Somerville (Mass.?) 1883-1884; list of boarders, 1921.

The Mooney family were farmers and prominent citizens of Alton, N.H. (B.M. Griffin, History of Alton (1965) gives Mooney cemetery records, page 160, but nothing else about them). The diaries are a gift of A.J. Schneider, 201 Woburn St., Reading Massachusetts.
